

Anime Review



sees a riot of color: brown, black, blonde, blue, pink, purple, green... Why? Well in manga the artwork is almost always black and white. If everyone had similar dark hair it would be hard

to distinguish different characters. So, they are often drawn with light hair. Then when the manga is animated colors selected can be quite interesting.
