

This left Executive Officers Laura Generous, Jada Parsons, Devin Staley, and P.R. Chairperson Brandie Huffman with most of the remaining details of the ceremony.

All went well, however, with several volunteers coming to the aid of their fellow classmates. Michael Thornton provided the music and served as an usher with Richard Brown. At the ceremony's end, old and new members mingled and enjoyed a covered-dish supper in the Thompson Hall lobby, graciously
