Roughly 70 participants from North Carolina community colleges and high schools attended the summer forum. Key speakers and participants included Scott Ralls, President of North Carolina Community College System, and Rebecca Garland, Executive Director of the North Carolina State Board of Education. The forum addressed internationalizing youth through the curriculum, global competence in current workforce, and strategic plans for globalization. Among other topics was introducing Chinese as a foreign language in the curriculum.

> 1 - Alumni Hall - Northwest corner Near the retaining wall and under the covered walkway 2 - Lowe's Hall - Southeast side (level one) Near retaining wall/walkway leading to back of Thompson Hall 3 - Hayes Hall - Southend along the wall between Hayes Hall and Lovette Hall and the Continuing Education Building 4 - Power Mechanics Building - S outh side (front) Left side away from doors / walkways 5 - Industrial Classroom Building (old headhouse) North end (right side facing building) on concrete area away from doors <u>6 - Daniel Hell</u> - East side (front of building) left of entrance / walkway 7 - Randoloh Hall - Southwest side on level one in the inclosed patio area 8 - Beacon Building - North side (back) under shelter away from doors/walks 9 - Horticultural Comolex - South side near edge of hill
