The benefit of friendship is that it helps to lift men to a higher level and makes them do their best. If we associate with Christ He will bring out the best there is in us."

The next was an address by Mr. Ramsour on the theme, "Missionary Department in Student Associations." The speaker handled this subject in a very splendid way. This was followed by some remarks on Mission Study Books led by Mr. Barnett, assisted by Dr. Weatherford and Mr. Summerville.

Saturday afternoon was given over to a general discussion of the social activities of the various associations: Wake Forest, Elon, Davidson, Carolina, and others, made interesting reports that indicated progressive work in these associations. These reported work done among factory people, the rural population, and the negroes. Many good suggestions were exchanged. This was followed by Mr. Wilson's talk on "The Y. M. C. A. Secretaryship as a Life Calling." The appeal of the calling was well presented.


On Sunday morning Dr. Weatherford again led the Bible Study in a most instructive way, which is characteristic of him. To appreciate Dr. Weatherford's labors in this conference one must be present at the Bible Study period.

Every evening at the close of the address the leaders of the Associations met in conferences to discuss the problems of Y. M. C. A. work. These were very interesting and instructive.
