saw that he had failed to pray for them to come. In the prayer for orphans he gave himself in complete dedication to God, and the prayer was answered an hundred fold. And even if there were many times when they did not know where the next meal was coming from, there were only two times that a meal had to be waited for half an hour. George Mueller had implicit faith in the Bible and in prayer. The children in the schools loved their teachers and loved George Mueller. He tried to preserve family life and to make the very atmosphere religious.

At the time of his death there were five orphans' homes with 1,620 orphans. The expense of these buildings had been \$820,000, yet he had never had to beg for money. Besides the work connected with the management of the orphanages he did many other things. He preached in practically all civilized countries of the world, did much to help circulate the Bible and was a great blessing to day schools, Sunday schools and missions. Why then was he a prophet? Because he was a man with a message. He was trying to prove to the world that God lived and answered prayer.
