The Philomathean and Zetasian Literary Societies presented a set of books to Jennie Howard Cannon, of Guilford High School, to whom the judges awarded first place among the girls. Her recitation was entitled "Flosie Lane's Marriage" and it was delivered in a very creditable manner.

To George Poe, of the Winston-Salem High School, the winner among the boys, a gold watch was presented. This prize was given by the Websterian and Henry Clay Literary Societies. "The Supposed Speech of John Adams" was the title of Mr. Poe's oration.
