Georgia; and also in Hartsville, S. C., at Coker college.

On the first Sunday en route the choir will sing three times: at Whiteville, N. C., in the morning; at Laurinburg, in the afternoon at 3:30; and at Hartsville, S. C., that night at 8 o'clock. The second Sunday is scheduled for two programs on the return trip, in the afternoon at Charlotte and at night, Albemarle. It is probably, according to Professor Weis, that radio, luncheon, and other such programs will be engaged throughout the trip for noon and afternoon appearances.

From the membership of about 64, 45 students have been selected to compose the group to make the trip. One of the new, streamlined Greyhound buses has been engaged to provide the transportation.
