Founders' Day **Program Announced**

Again this year, in celebration of its founding, Guilford College is sponsoring a three-day program with special emphasis upon her contributions to higher education in the state, the nation, and the world; her contributions as a Quaker College to the Ecumenical Movement of the state, nation and world; and the role of the Society of Friends in relation to the churches.

The opening address will be given at 11:15 a.m., November 10, by President Gordon Gray of the Consolidated University of North Carolina. President Gray received his A. B. from U. N. C. and his LL. B. from Yale Law School. He served as a member of the North Carolina State Senate from 1938-42 and from 1946-47. Prior to becoming president of the Greater University in 1950 he served as Secretary of the Army. At present he is working with a committee of the United Nations.

Thursday, November 11 at 8:00 m. in Memorial Hall, President Courtney C. Smith of Swarthmore College will deliver the second lecture of the series of convocations. President Smith received his A. B., A. M., and Ph. D. from Harvard, and studied as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University in 1938-39. He served as a member of the UNSR from 1944 to 1946 and taught at Princeton University until 1953. He has recently been elected pres-
