

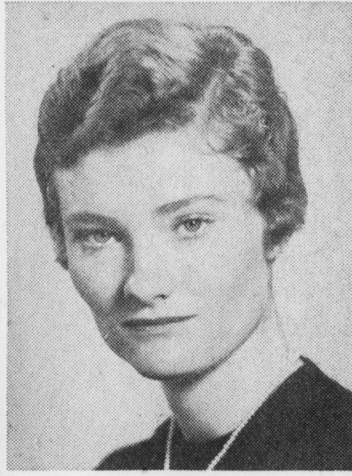
BURTON, McFARLAND SEEK SOCIAL COMMITTEE POSITION

Nominees Chosen For IRC Offices

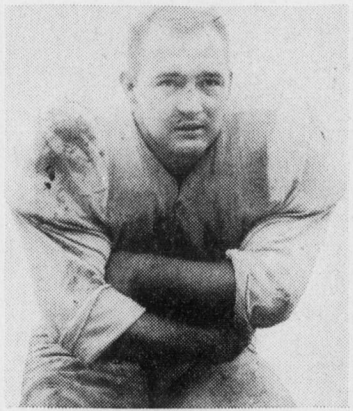

Giap Vu is a new student here this year. His home is in Vietnam. Giap is interested in studying fields related to political science.

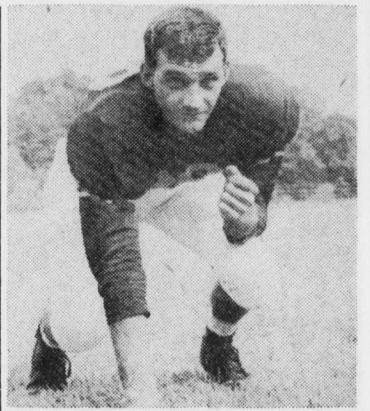

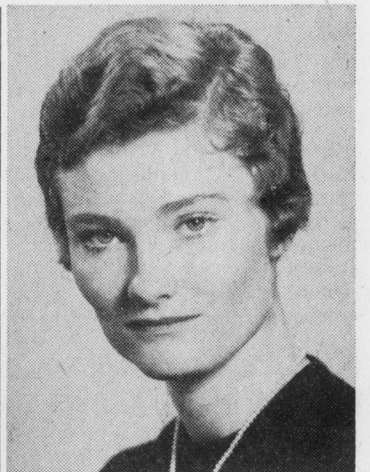

Daryl Kent to Speak About Hobbes at March 27 Lecture

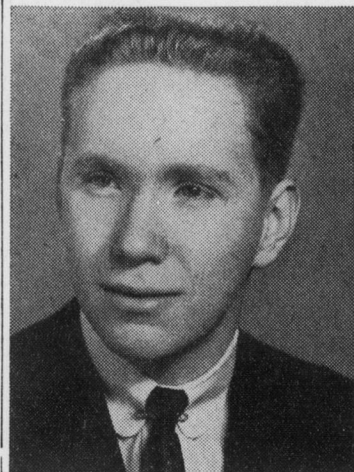

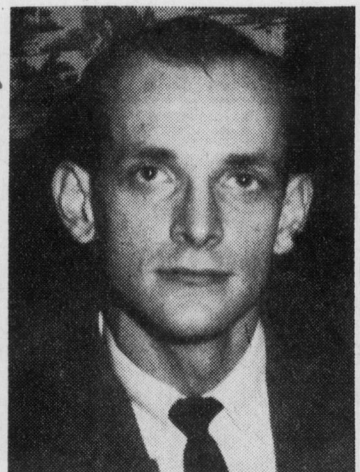
SUITER, HOLLAND WILL CONTEND FOR REVELER'S CLUB PRESIDENT
