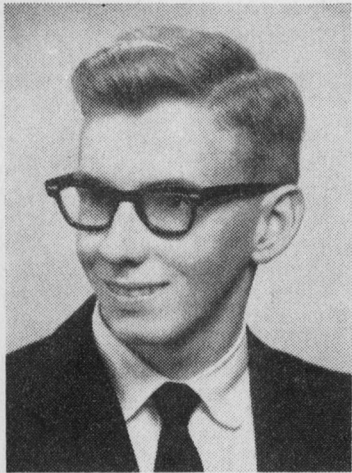
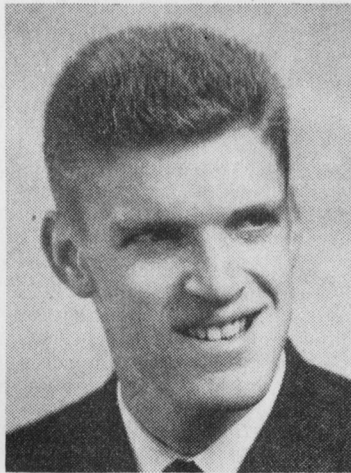


MSG Will Run All Nominees On Tickets and by Petition

Officers nominated for president of the Student Christian Association are Evelyn Copeland, Bill Rhoads, and Judi Tindall.

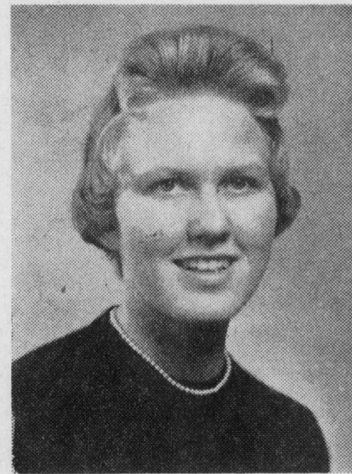
