Annual Concerts

The Guilford College A Cappella Choir will begin its Christmas season with a concert at Graham's First Baptist Church at 3 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 8.

The annual Christmas program for the student body will be Thursday, Dec. 12, in Dana Auditorium. The concert will include several carols from various foreign countries, as well as familiar English songs.

The college choir will expand into the Community Chorus for the annual Yule concert on Sunday, Dec. 15, at 3 p.m. Instead of presenting the traditional "Messiah" by Handel, the choir will sing the Vivaldi "Gloria," followed by Benjamin Britten's "A Ceremony of Carols" by the girls' chorus. The concert will be concluded by Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus."

Soloists for the "Gloria" will be Marilyn Burris, talented wife of Guilford's academic dean, and Judi Pinnix.
