Scored 141 points (Taylor high with 42) but weak defensive unit allowed 322 including 69 by Lenoir Rhyne and 55 by Appalachian. Prospects: Currently, the Indians stand 3-3 overall, 0-2 with the league. They have defeated Gardner-Webb, Concord, and Mars Hill while losing to Catawba (21-20), Lenoir Rhyne (42-7), and Wofford (49-14). Quarterback Johnny Harbin has taken over for Gary Welchel, Jolly Hallman leads the rushers while Roger Hazel and Howdy Hays lead the pass receivers. In the offensive line, center Joby Castles, and tackles Larry Howe and Al Granzow are standouts. The Indians appear to have strengthened their defensive


