

## Guilford Moves Into District Playoffs

With a nerve-shattering 101-98 victory over high-powered Gardner-Webb, Guilford gained a berth in District 26 playoff action, a goal which eluded last year's 19-8 team.

Coach Jack Jensen, who aims his team toward national competition, got his goal by virtue of a 16-4 record, best by far in the district. Had the Quakers lost, the championship of the Carolinas Conference tourney would have been the necessary ticket of further competition.

Guilford is seeded second in the four day affair by way of a coin flip which Lenoir Rhyne won, and gained the

privilege of playing the league's worst team, Pfeiffer, on Wednesday. Guilford contests Atlantic Christian at 7:00 pm in the Lexington YMCA.

Guilford has beaten ACC twice this season, but the Wilson team has improved; witness a defeat of Mars Hill earlier this week. Unless the Quakers lose, they advance to meet the winner of the High Point-Elon game on Friday evening.

Lloyd Free led the Garner-Webb victory with 35 points, as the Quakers climaxed a late season surge toward the tournament. Trailing 21-10 after eight minutes, Free dumped in ten of sixteen GC

points as the Quakers went up 26-24. Two minutes later, behind by three, the Quakers got points from Free, East, Jackson and Massengill while rushing to seven point advantage.

Guilford inched its way to an eight point margin midway through the closing half, but the Bulldogs took advantage of Guilford foul trouble to lead 86-85 with five minutes to go. After Free regained the lead for Guilford, the two teams swapped points, the Quakers always leading by at least one, until G-W walked on a chance to go ahead. Free and East hit free throws to sew up the victory.

## FILM NOTES

"Elvira Madigan," said to be "perhaps the most beautiful movie in history," will be presented at 8 p.m. in Dana Auditorium on Tuesday, March 6. Admission price is 50 cents for Guilford students.

The film is based on a true story about a young Swedish army officer around 1900 who runs off with Elvira, a lovely young circus artist.

Pia Degermark, then a newcomer to the screen, won the "Best Actress" award at Cannes. Thommy Berggren, who plays opposite her in this emotionally tense tale of forbidden romance, won the top acting award of Sweden, where the movie was made.

Some observers have called "Elvira Madigan" a tone poem but especially in its visual aspects it achieves the lyrical quality that produced such critical and popular acclaim.
