## ANDY GOTTSCHALL CHANGES JOBS

Editor's note: The following memorandum was received on Monday of this week. It will be followed by an interview with Dean Gottschall to appear in next week's Guilfordian.

Because of several unforeseen circunstances in the Department of Sociology, I have asked Andy Gottschall to resume full-time teaching and administrative duties in sociology with the beginning of the coming spring term. While Andy's leadership will be missed in Student Personnel, I am confident

that his full-time involvement in the Sociology Department will greatly strengthen that segment of our academic program.

Additionally, upon Andy Gottschall's recomme ndation, I have asked Ken Schwab to assume the responsibility of Acting Dean of Students. Ken has had several years of experience with our student services programs and I have every confidence in his ability to effectively assume his new duties.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity of this anouncement to thank Andy Gottschall for his three years of strong leadership as Dean of Students, and for his willingness to assist in the resolution of our immediate need's in the Department of Sociology by agreeing to return to fulltime teaching and administrative duties a semester earlier that originally planned. With this adjustment, I am certain that our program in sociology will be immediately strengthened, and that the college will be in a distinctly better position to meet its academic responsibilities to several student constituencies.
