Rape Crisis Control Center

There is a Rape Crisis Control Center in Greensboro. These people will assist any woman or man who has been raped. The Center also provides counseling for husbands, sons, brothers, and fathers of rape victims. The Center has not, as yet, helped in an immediate rape crisis situation, but they have done counseling with previous rape victims. Starting on Tuesday, September 23rd there will be seminars and panel discussions on rape at the YWCA. General information, police procedures, medical and legal procedures will be discussed.

The Public Defender of the Greensboro Courts and persone from Moses Cone will be some of the speakers on the agenda. Every Tuesday, from September 23rd until October 28th, at 8:00 p.m. at the YWCA on Davie Street, the Rape Crisis Control Center will hold seminars and panel discussions open to the
