The Williams campaign platform offered many practical ideas which apparently appealed to voters. Briefly, the platform is as follows:

(1) A booklet should be published which thoroughly evaluates courses and professors from information compiled from the findings of a special committee, interviews, and student comments.

(2) Students should be better informed on the Honor Code. A booklet on the code should be distributed to all new students to impress upon them its importance.

(3) Wednesday should be kept as a "free" day.

(4) Senate funds should be used to form a student-run co-op for used books.

(5) More attendtion should be paid to assigning roomates and locating living areas according to students' requests.

(6) Consortium Bus hours should be extended until 6 p.m.

(7) The Food Committee should be strengthened by more careful selection of its members.

Williams, Lee, and McLemore also feel that senators and the Executive officers must continually seek to provide constituents with direct channels by which to air their grievances.

SENATE MINUTES, 2/23/77

The meeting opened with a moment of silence. Kim Chinn, Christie Fletcher and Frank Keegan were absent.

A correction was made in last week's minutes. The decision regarding campaign spending limits has not been

Hugh Stohler presented two proposals to the Senate that would affect the budgeting of Student Activity Fees. The first proposal is based on a concern about the legal use of student fees and the precedents set by funding organizations that are politically and religiously oriented. The proposal is that the Senate "adopt a clear policy which establishes that it will not fund student political organizations or religious-denominational organizations in the annual

budgeting process. The Senate might, however, inform any such organizations that they may come to the Senate requesting special funding for any particular program, if that proposed program is clearly not of partisan or sectarian content." As there was no consensus on whether or not to accept the proposal, Senators will discuss it with their constituents and it will be presented again next week.

The second part of Hugh's proposal was a recommendation that the Senate re-affirm current budget policies that have not been followed traditionally. Some of of the organizations have not adhered to these policies in the past few years. The budget practices in question were: 1. Returning unexpended funds in student organization accounts to the Community Senate account at the end of the school year.

2. Having all organizations submit their books to the Business Office for an audit during the summer; and that all organizations submit records of their income and expenses to the Treasurer before they receive their allotments for the following year.

The Senate approved a change in the requirements for Student Emergency Loans. The fund will still be used primarily for "unforeseen * medical and family emer-gencies", but may also be used for other purposes that are clearly seen to emergencies by the Executive Council.
