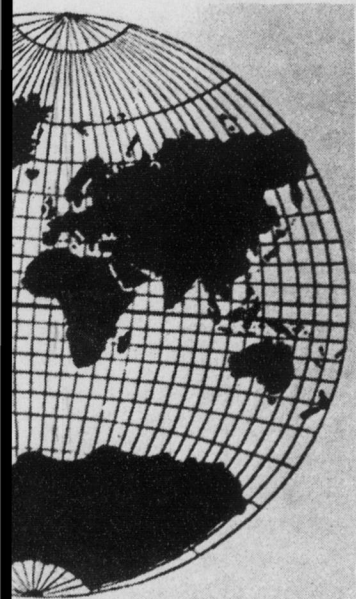

Summer schools abroad



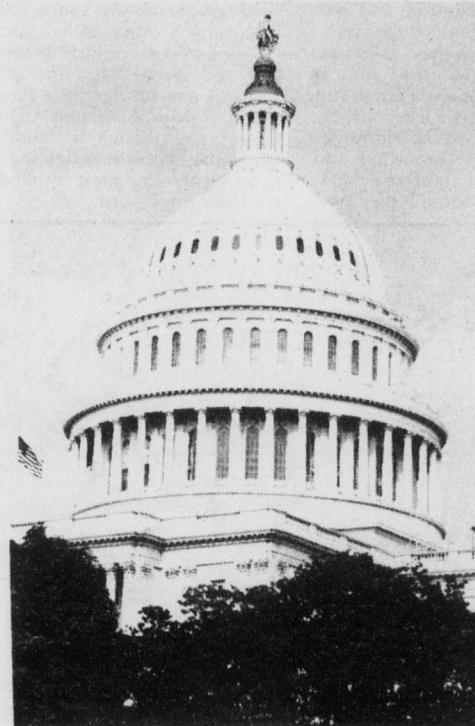

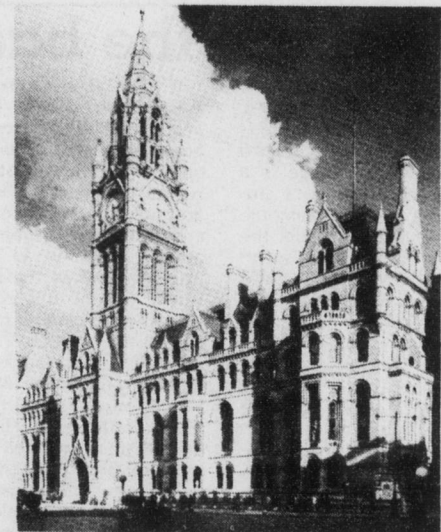
