Fund lobbying update

About a month ago, several students including myself, attended the National Student Lobby Day in Washington to lobby financial aid. While we were there, we were informed of the proposed budget cuts and then urged to return to Guilford to initiate original action. This feeling was particularly expressed by Congressmen and Senators who said that they were not hearing from those who would be the most affected: students.

For this reason, the Community Senate has decided to undertake a project which will get our Community involved. Thus far, we have planned a large-scale letter writing campaign encompassing students,

faculty and staff, parents, and local high schools and universities. Several aspects of this plan have begun: a luncheon was held last week with many area high school Student Body Presidents and principals, at which they were informed about the proposed cuts and told what they could do; several weeks ago there was a meeting of the Deans of universities, where the principal subject was financial aid; further, Bill Rogers and I have co-written a letter to parents which asks them to help us by writing to their representatives.

To involve our campus, I urge all students, faculty, and staff to join in our campuswide letter writing campaign on April 12th

and 13th. To assist you in this process, we will have an area set up in Dana Lounge during lunch and dinner on these days where we will provide stationery, pens, stamps, and information which will assist those writing letters. Please come by on April 12th and 13th so that you can have the opportunity to voice your opinions.

To culminate this letter writing campaign, Eugene Johnston, the Congressman representing Greensboro, has agreed to come speak at Guilford on the 26th of April at 12:30 outside of Founders. He will respond to the letters we have written him and will answer questions.
