Other services were held in Pennsylvania for family and friends in the area and in Santa Monica, California, where her mother, Mary Pelletier, lives.

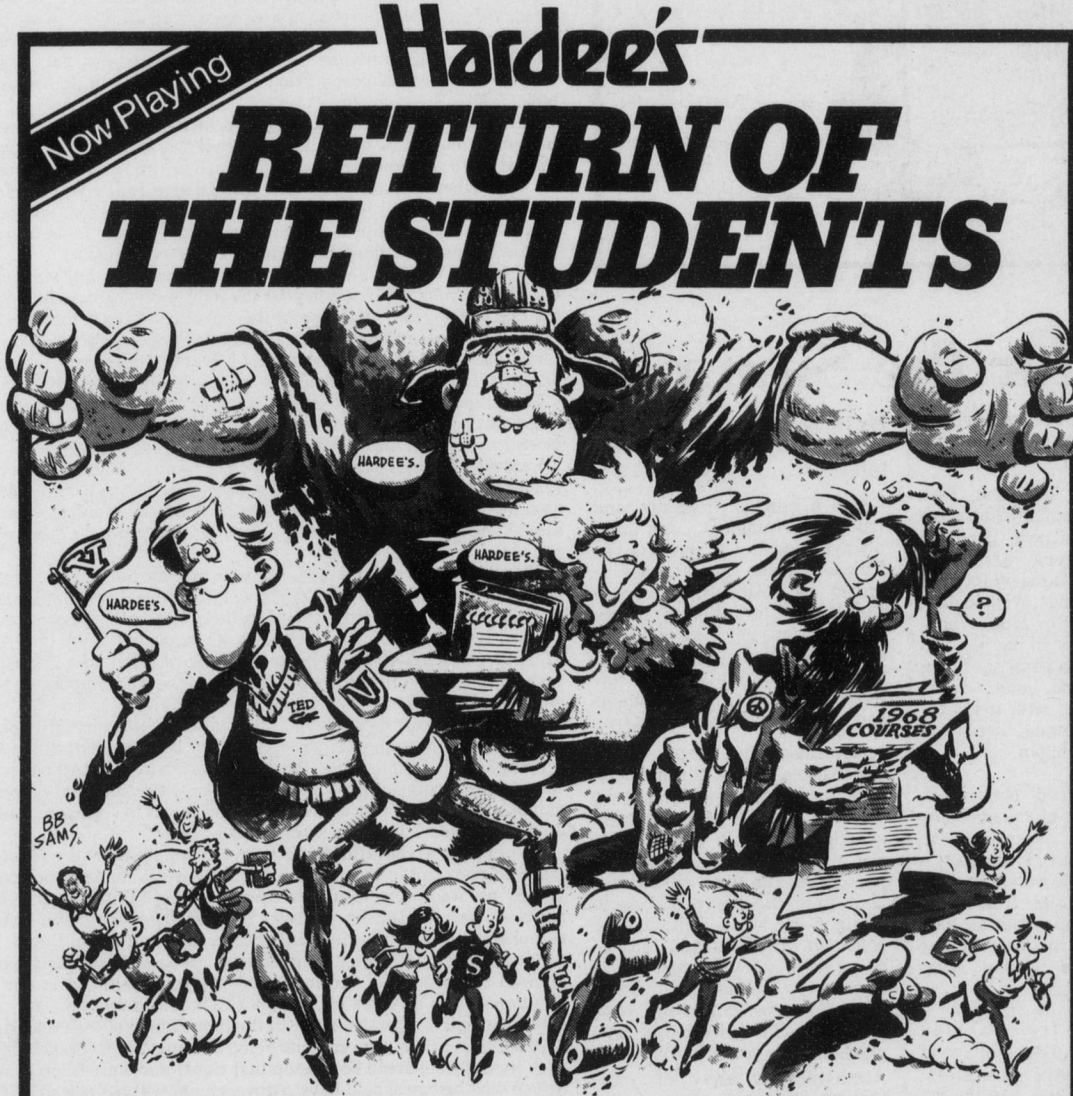

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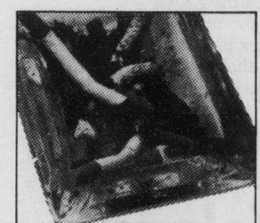
