UNC-G's first and second annual Jitters Jogs were held on a course laid out around campus as part of the Spring Fling weekend. There were 109 and 179 entrants respectively. The title of the race, contributed by Dr. Lois Andreasen of the Dance faculty, was chosen to highlight the value of physical activity in coping with stress that students, faculty and the general public feel at this time of year.

This year's event is sponsored by UNC-G's Division of Campus Recreation, Elliott University Center Council and Pepsi Cola Bottling Co. of Greensboro. The Jitters Jog will consist of a 2 mile fun run and a 5 mile run. The run is free for UNC-G students, faculty and staff. The general public participation fee is \$3.00 before April 12, \$5.00 thereafter. Proceeds after expenses will go to the UNC-G Emergency Student Fund.

The race will start at Rosenthall Gym parking lot on the UNC-G campus at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 14, 1984. Awards will be presented in the Quad adjacent to the finish of the course. Early registration is encouraged. T-shirts will only be guaranteed for the first 200 entrants. The event will be conducted rain or shine, except in the event of severe weather.
