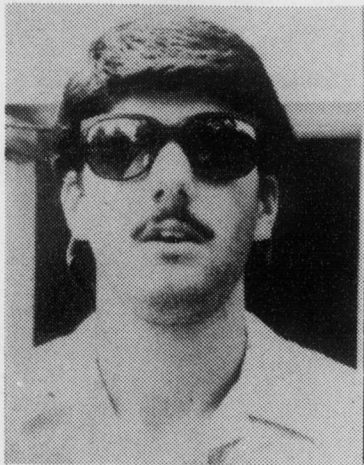


What faculty member would you like to see play Dracula in the fall production?

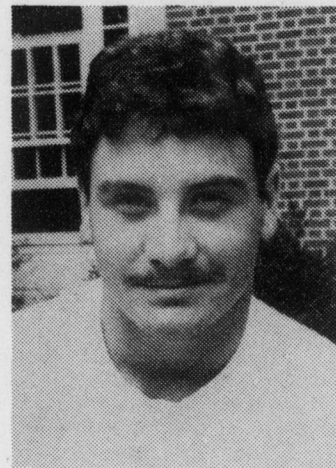
Chip Van Reenan: Jane Bengel, because she is beastly!
