## "Recyclables"

**Aluminum:** All beverage cans must be clean and dry.

**Cardboard:** All colors and types of unwaxed and uncoated corrugated cardboard accepted. Must be clean and dry.

**Glass:** All colors, shapes and sizes accepted. Remove lids and caps. Must be clean and dry.

**Magazines:** Must be dry and bundled in string or a brown paper bag.

**Newspapers:** All types, including *The Guilfordian*. Must be dry and bundled in string or brown paper bags.

**Office paper:** Includes white, colored, green-bar, envelopes, post-it notes, card stock, file folders, and NCR paper. Dry bundles preferable to loose quantities.

**Plastics:** Wash and dry and remove all tops. Plastics coded PETE-1, HDPE-2, PVC-3, or PS are acceptable. Plastic bags, as well as packing materials (e.g. packaging peanuts) aren't recyclable.

**Steel:** Steel/tin cans must be dry, clean, and wrapped with a bow on top. The detached lids aren't recyclable.
