

Haynes named all-district for second straight year

L a u r a Haynes can add one more accolade to the enormous stack of praise and awards which she has received in her years at Guilford.

For the second time in her four years at Guilford, Haynes was selected to the Kodak/Women's B a s k e t b a 1 l Coaches Association All-District 5 team. The 40 all-

district players are chosen from around the country, and all are now eligible to be on the 10-member Kodak All-America team to be announced March 21. She also placed on the team in 1997.

Haynes is clearly one of the best players the ODAC has ever seen. She has set career ODAC highs in scoring with 2,283 points, and is also tops in ca-


