The temporary federal budget An estimated 30 Guilford was set to expire on Friday, April 8 and the Republicans and Democrats in Congress could not reach an agreement for the rest of the fiscal year. This funding cut was one of the last policies to be decided, and in their final compromise, the bill was not passed.

The eleventh-hour budget decision did not include any of the policies against Planned Parenthood, according to NPR. The "More people should have been debate for the funding, however, is not over as the government plans for the 2012 budget.
