Clubhouse are also free for anyone who is 21 or older with college identification, not just Guilford students, and there is live music both weekend nights.

you know," said senior Gabo Lemos. "It's especially packed on Wednesday nights; because that's the night everyone's ready to take a break."

Most Guilford students visit The Clubhouse because it is within walking distance — which is imperative for those without a car or a designated driver — and because they know people who hang out there. However, one of the main reasons to go to The Clubhouse cited by people who know her is a local bartender known as Shimmi Updatree. On Guilford College nights, shooters are only three dollars, and most people who are of-age prefer to request Shimmi shots.

"Whatever the Universe shoots into my brain at any given time is what I put in the shaker," said Updatree when asked how to make a Shimmi shot. "It's got to be within my righteous abilities to make it delicious, but the Universe is never wrong."


