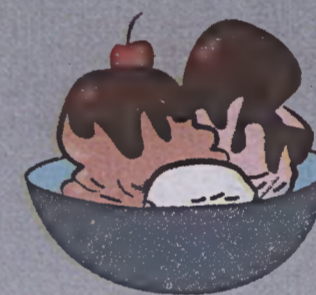
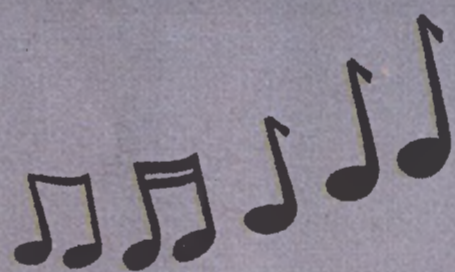

Four hundred fifty- That is the number of votes in the last North Carolina election due to new anti-fraud laws, according to Democracy North Carolina.

The voters disproportionately Democrats, with the majority among black voters. Voted of the voters in this election they accounted for 40 percent of the rejected votes.

These numbers have raised questions about whether the new law will be used for their sake.

Republicans even lost the 2008 election. Obama campaign ... and African-American voters straight-ticket voting registration (both the new law), Bob Hall of Democracy North Carolina said in a photo of the Guilfordian in a photo were definitely cherry-picked.
