The government of Punjab, India, is serionsly attacking the colossal problem of illiteracy, Seventy thousand boys were added to the school enrollment in 1921-'22 and 150,000 in 1922-2.3, but it is exceedingly
difficult to keep them in school. Three-fifths of them dropt out before entering the sceond class, and less than one-fourth continue to the fourth class. Even of those who remain long enough to be classed as literate many soon relapse after literate many soon relapse aftr
leaving school into the mass of illitcrates about them.
$A$ beginning has been made in adult education and adult pupils who slow competence and enthusiasm often attain literacy after six months tuition. - Ex .
