Addresses Y. W. C. A.**

The Work of the Junior League is Subject of Interesting Talk by Salem Alumna.

On Friday evening, November 22, the Y. W. C. A. had as its guest Mrs. Ralph Stockton, an alumna of Salem, who spoke to the meeting concerning the work of the Junior League, giving a brief outline of its national importance.

Mrs. Stockton stated that the Junior League work is as interesting as it is helpful. The girls work by means of a point system. Each girl must give two hours a week to this work, and any hour that is missed must be made up within six weeks or the girl is expelled from the League.

The Junior League has many ways of making its money. Of importance is the Charity Dance given each year in June at the Robert E. Lee Hotel. Rummage sales and bazaars are also held at suitable intervals.

The members of this organization are doing a wonderful work.

Among many other services rendered are the meals served to the Y. W. C. A. girls, the wholesome lunches served to the factory girls at a low price, the musical programs given for those girls, and especially the services of the trained nurse, who goes into the poorest homes of the city in order to better the health and living conditions.
