matic schools of piano music as shown in the clearness and precision of the Bach "Suite," her poetic feeling in the Chopin, "Polonaise," and by a vivid interpretation of Chopin's stirring "Revolutionary Etude." The Etude showed Katherine's facility in performing difficult octave, scale, and arpeggio work. In the modern manner, was Gershwin's prelude with syncopated rhythms and "jazzy" harmony. Beethoven's B flat concert with organ accompaniment by Dean Vardell brought the program to a climactic close.

Louise Norris' voice gave lovely coloristic affects particularly in her second number, "At Times My Thoughts Come Drifting," by Brahms, and in the aria from Saint-Saens's "Samson and Dalila." As well as having an unusually rich quality in her voice, Louise portrayed her ability to perform light and novelty numbers such as "There's Something I've Been Wanting" and "Maria Glutton."

Miss Thompson's piano accompaniments, sometimes light, then majestic, added much to the success of the recital.
