she is just a child prodigy grown up. Her playing has matured and improved since she began her concert career at the age of eight until now she is ranked one of the four greatest living violinists. She is very pretty in a short, plump, Italian way, although the footlights did her injustice.

Miss Morini played her concert on an interesting, old Stradavarius violin, which is dated 1727 and valued at forty-five thousand dollars. She uses this violin only for concert work and has another instrument for practicing.

Miss Morini took many liberties in her playing. For instance, she rested her ear on the chin rest of the violin, and she kept her eyes closed all the time she was playing. She made no attempt to win the audience with her personality—she merely walked on the stage and started to play and the audience was won by her music.
