

### Warren Presents Unusual Program

As the first song drew to a close, everyone sat back to enjoy the remainder of the program—that tense questioning was gone. Leonard Warren, leading baritone of the Metropolitan Opera Company, gave an unusually satisfying performance of variety and interest to all.

The first group of songs consisted of the appropriate Handel "Thanks Be to Thee" and "O Rudder than the Cherry" from Acls and Galatea. The latter was especially demonstrative of true flexibility and even register. These were followed by the familiar and lovely "Tu lo sai" by Torelli and Buononcini's "L'esperto nocchiero." Mr. Warren chose from the large field of lieder: "Oh That I Might Retrace the Way," Brahms; "The Drummer," "Secrecy," and "Verborgtheit," by Wolf; and "The Hidalgo," Schumann. His gestures, genial personality, and excellent projection did much toward making this group outstanding.

The well known aria "Eri tu" from The Masked Ball by Verdi proved so popular it was followed by "The Toreador Song" from Bizet's Carmen.

The group played by Milford Snell, accompanist, was highly appreciated by the audience. It included Beethoven's "Bagatelle" and Chopin's "Allegro de Concert." His encores were "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring" (Bach) and Faure's "Impromptu."

His last group included both British and American songs. Encores were "Cap'n MacPherson," "A Little Bit of Heaven," and an unusually impressive rendition of Malotte's "The Lord's Prayer."

Sidelights on Leonard Warren: He's an opera star with a pronounceable name . . . he's a favorite down South America way—there never seem to be enough seats whenever he gives a concert . . . Brazil has presented him with scrooh of honor—the second time in the history of that country an opera star has been so honored . . . he made his debut in 1938 on Friday the 13th—his first appearance in an operatic role and his first night at the Met . . . he's opposed to opera in English unless the libretto is completely rewritten to fit the music, otherwise a note is chopped here and one added there . . . his inspiration is a blond named Agatha—Mrs. Warren to you . . . his ideal vacation is a fishing trip, with lots of golf on the side . . . he likes movies, radio, gun rummy, dancing, fishing, football games—he's superstitious about hats on beds . . . he doesn't object to women smoking and his pet hobby is collecting miniature railroads . . . his wife collects tropical fish! He has a personality plus with a Bob Hope chin to boot . . .
