

Technical work for the Pierrettes' fall production, Hedda Gabler by Henrik Ibsen, is nearing completion in the Dramatics Workshop. Over fifty people, a greater number than ever before, have been working on the sets, costumes, makeup, and publicity for the play. New techniques, mainly with character makeup and set construction, are being introduced to improve the technical aspects of the theatre.

The set for Hedda Gabler, which takes place in Norway at the turn of the century, consists of corduroy walls with crewel designs in felt, and "wood" paneling made of contact paper. These new set materials provide a more realistic set than the muslin formerly used in set construction. As Lee Torrence, set designer for Hedda Gabler says, "Also, the heavy appearance of the set supports the leading character Hedda, who is an unfeminine woman with expensive taste." The intricate crewel design which decorates the corduroy is a popular design in Norway because the warm colors of gold, orange, red, and turquoise, offset the cold Norwegian weather. Lee has been able to use much imagination in her set design although she recalls basic ideas from her trip to Oslo two simmers ago.

Likewise, costumes for Hedda Cabler have been designed to offset cold, dreary Norway. Colors range from lavender to vivid black and white stripe for the costumes of the four female characters in
