

Salem Is One Of Sixteen Institutions To Participate in Internship Program

Salem College will be participating in an Administrative Intern Program for Women in Higher Education during the 1974-1975 academic year. The announcement came from Dr. Chandler during the January semester.

Funded by the Carnegie Corporation, the program will provide an administrative internship at each of the sixteen participating institutions. Designed to provide colleges and universities with a supply of qualified women for entry-level positions in all phases of academic administration, the program will stress training in areas such as financial aid, admissions, business affairs, academic affairs, public relations and development.

The ten-month internship includes a two week summer workshop in academic administration. Each intern will work with a senior administrator at the college to which she is assigned. She will observe and participate in activities for which her supervisor is responsible. She will also engage in a study or project designed to deepen her understanding of the problems of college administra-

college graduates, or are completing programs leading to appropriate degrees, or are faculty members with an expressed interest in administration in higher education are eligible. Each intern will receive a stipend of \$6,876.
