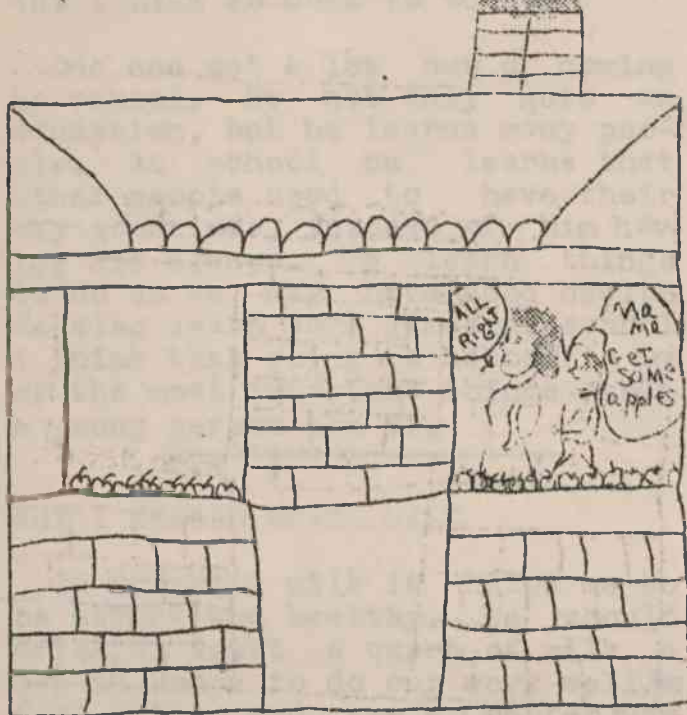


FIRST GRADE GROCERY STORE
