The state is divided into five districts, and there are 76 schools in the First District. The winning Chapter of each district received a cash prize of \$20.00.

THOMAS FINCH WINS F.F.A. HONORS.

Thomas Finch, son of Mr. and Mrs. H.R. Finch of Bailey, won the first District Supervised Practice Contest and was awarded the Carolina Farmer Degree at the State F.F.A. Convention. For these accomplishments Thomas receives a free trip to The National F.F.A. Convention in Kansas City, Mo., in October and \$5.00.

The points on which he won the Supervised Practice Contest are based on the number and size of projects, ownership of projects, improved practices made, home improvement, and savings.

The points on which he won the Star Farmer Contest are based on Participation in Chapter Activities, thrift (use of time, talent and money), Scholarship, Sportsmanship, (in and out of school), Degrees held, and Initiative.

In three years Thomas has had a total of thirteen projects with a total net profit of \$464.45.

This is the second year in succession that these honors have come to members of the Bailey Chapter, Thelbert Boykin having received the same honors last year. The Chapter hopes to have another winner this year!
