CLUB NEWS

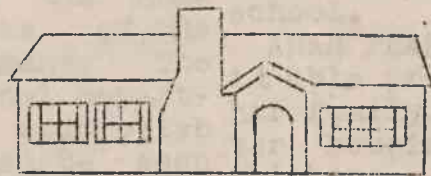
