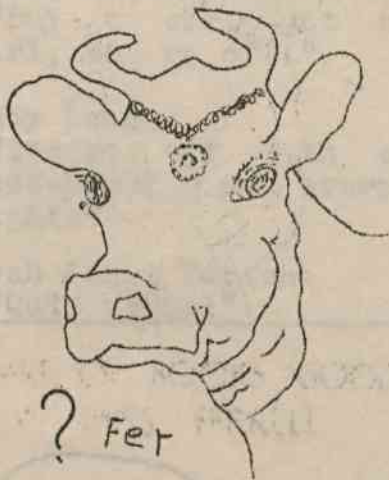


WHETHER SEEKING INFORMATION OR RECREATION — VISIT THE LIBRARY

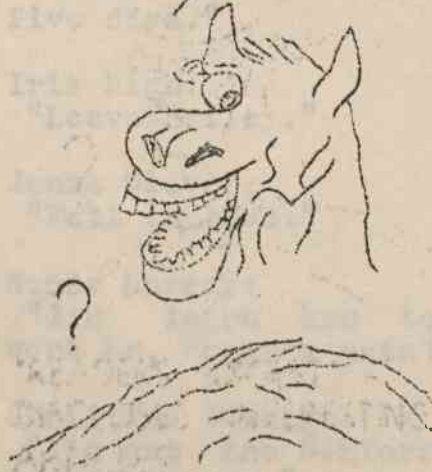

VARIED TYPES OF READING REQUIRED

BOOKS CLASSIFIED

To acquaint students with all types of reading rather than encouraging them to form the habit of reading only one type, the English department requires books of different classification to be read each month for credit.

The classification required for the eighth, ninth, and tenth grades are as follows: fiction, 2; adventure and travel, 2; historical, 2; nature, 1; and biography, 1.

The eleventh grade is required to read four classics, including the works of outstanding authors as Shakespeare, Dickens, Thackeray, and Scott. The remaining four books may be taken from the list.
