

Bookmobile Will Tour County

By December 1, Nash County Library Board hopes to have in operation a bookmobile that will possibly stop at twenty-four communities throughout the county.

The Rocky Mount Public Library; containing eighteen thousand volumes, will be the source from which the bookmobile will get its supply of books.

As a result of this step, Bailey Public Library, the center for this community, will have an approximate turnover of 125 books semi-monthly.
