Bailey School Secures Garden

Through the persistent efforts of Mr. C. H. Walker the Bailey High School has been designated as one of the three schools in the county to have a garden. Requirements are a five-acre garden and a goal of 5,000 quarts to be canned during the summer.

The Middlesex school has agreed to meet one fifth of the expenses of the garden and thus share in one-fifth of the canning. Mt. Pleasant school will be given this opportunity if it desires to meet the same terms as spe-

cified for Middlesex. Eight W.P.A. workers are enrolled in this project, one, a man who will have the supervision of the garden in charge. Land has been donated by Messrs A. B. Farmer and Roger Finch. In order to have cool quarters for the canning, the work shop in the agricultural building will be used during the summer months. Williford has likewise met the state requirements. Castalia is the third school expecting to obtain a garden.
