PROPER FOOD ELIMINATES WEAKNESS IN HOGS

Because of the lack of sufficient minerals in the feed, hogs get weak in the legs and back. This deficiency may be supplied with a mixture of:

Limestone 10 parts
Bone meal 5 parts
Salt 2 parts

This mixture can be secured from the agriculture department. Made by the class members as a service to the farmers of the community, it can be purchased at 2 cents per pound.

dle hogs as well as rotation of pasture.


