FARM PRACTICE PROGRAM Mapped For 1942

Forty-five boys taking Vocational Agriculture have made plans for more than one hundred different projects:

30 fattening hogs for home meat.

20 brood sows (18 pure bred)

48 acres of corn 24 acres of tobacco 9 acres of cotton

21 acres of soybeans 16 acres of wheat 2 dairy cows 600 chickens

l¹/₂ acres improved pasture

2 acres of fruit and

truck crops.
