A chorus composed of high school girls sang songs in keeping with the pageant.

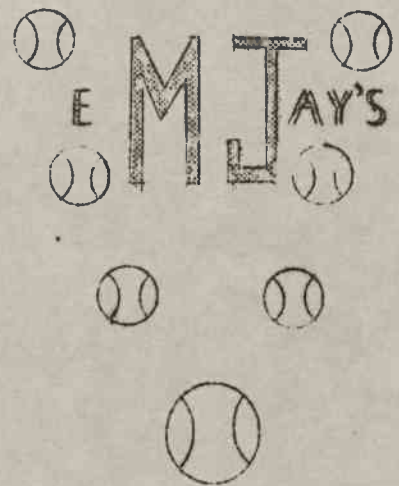
Teachers conducting the pageant were Mrs. Laurine T. Lassiter, Mrs. H.A. Morse, and Miss Melba Martin.

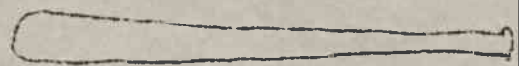
