Circus side shows preceded the performances in the rings. The grand parade and various ring acts were performed by seniors.

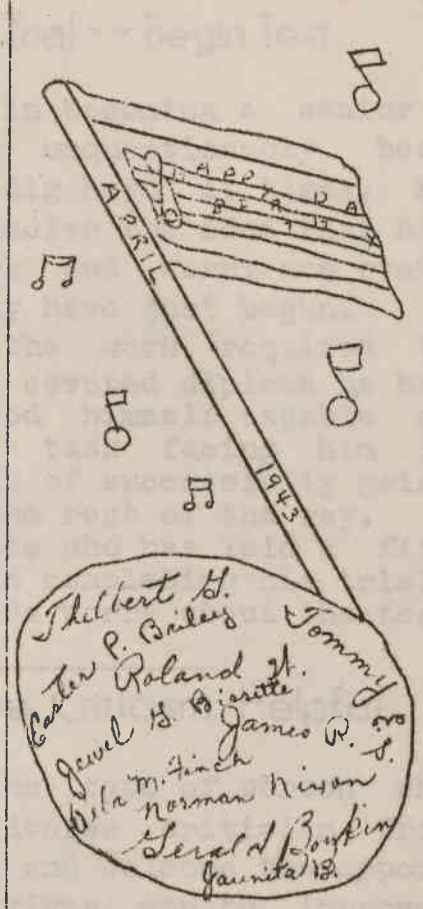
Tommy Etheridge's clown tricks added much to the general enjoyment.
