Cammunity Cannery To Be Completed

In response to the demade for food conservation, the local community cannery, built in cooperation with the county, state, and federal authorities, is nearing completion.

COMMUNITY HELPS

The boiler fixtures, cookers, vats, kettles, grinders, and sealers were secured by the government, federal while the county furnished the building. Through the cooperation of the people and the food conservation program sponsored by the Bailey agriculturdepartment last al the project spring, was made possible

EQUIPMENT NEEDED

To make this a complete unit equipped for canning, the Bailey community will need to furnish knives, pans, tubs and strainers. This will call for an expenditure of about one hundred dollars.

It is hoped that this equipment will be ready by the time the cannery is completed.

Final details for the operation are in the making. The cannery is to be used by the people under the supervision of a person trained to operate it. A small fee for the operation will be the only cost.

COURSES OFFERED .

In order that several people may become familiar with the operation of the canhery, minimum courses during the fall and winter will be offered, including only twelve or thirteen indivuals at one time.

REQUIREMENTS

Anyone interested in this training before canning season may see Mr. L. Tapp and make reservation for the group. Efforts will be made to enroll all desiring the course.
