When the boys and girls from both sections met on the college campus, those of the South never had a fair chance. All their classmates were far more educated than they, having had two months more schooling for twelve years.

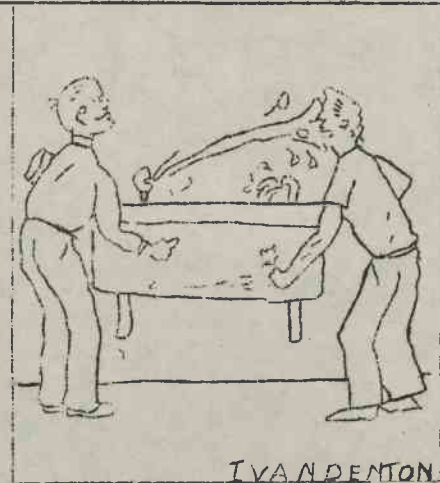
So thank Heaven and the legislature for the extra month each year. One more month can make all the difference in the world.
