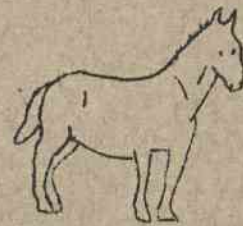
Such terms as balance sheet, profit and loss statement, adjusting and closing entries, journalizing and work sheet are confusing terms.
