HEALTH PROGRAM BEGINS AT BAILEY

MISS WEAVER TO ASSIST WITH SCREENING

Comprising one study group, the teachers of Middlesex, Bailey, Mt. Pleasant, and Ferrells are meeting twice a week with State Health Service officials to study plans for promoting general health.

At the first meeting, November 3, Dr. Jacocks, head of the state program, stressed the importance of healthful school living and stated that health facilities would be checked and recommendations be offered.

"The school and its grounds should be a model of cleanliness and beauty for every child," declared Dr. Jacocks.

CHECK UP

Check up will include such items as heat, fire hazards, nutrition, lighting, water supply, toilet conditions, and general cleanliness of building and grounds.

Visiting Bailey November 18 and working with the teachers in discovering any defects a child may have that impair his mental and physical growth will be Miss Weaver.

MEETINGS

Meetings will alternate between Bailey and Middlesex schools. Other subjects to be discussed are health habits, physical education, and communicable diseases.
