

### SHOP OPEN FOR REPAIRS

The school shop is open to the people of Bailey high school area every Wednesday night from 7:30 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. for repairing farm equipment. Anyone needing repairs made may bring his work under the supervision of a shop instructor. The only charge will be the cost of the material used.

Each farmer is urged to check his equipment thoroughly for needed repairs before planting season.

Welding and general repairs will be the basis of the shop work.

### Glover Follows Rules In Saving Pigs

Thelbert Glover, a Bailey Future Farmer, demonstrates how to save pigs. He has two registered sows, a Duroc Jersey and a spotted Poland China. These sows have farrowed in one year 44 pigs and lost only two.

Thelbert follows approved practices for saving pigs.

The sows are placed in a good farrowing house with guard rails a few days before the pigs come. The sows are fed lightly for a few days. Needle teeth are checked and removed the first day.

The bedding is thin to avoid having a hole in which the sow can lay on the pigs.

### BONDS TO BE GIVEN FOR CORN PRODUCTION

To stimulate better corn production and help relieve the feed situation, a bond will be given in 1944 to one person in each community in the county on the following basis:

1. A farmer must enter a five acre plot.
2. A Future Farmer or 4H member must enter a three acre plot.

The one producing corn the most economical will receive the bond. A complete record must be kept and the entry turned into the vocational agriculture teacher or the county agent.
