AGRICULTURE BOYS GET PRACTICE IN TRADES

For shop practice the junior and senior agriculture classes were divided into trade groups.

Plumbing, electricity, sheet metal work, and equipment assembly are being learned by setting up the cannery.

The groups work at their chosen trades.

FARMERS CLEAN SEED

Thirty-four quarts of tobacco seed have been cleaned by the Future Farmers since Christmas for seventy-one different farmers.

Cleaning seed is a good practice for the boys states Mr. Leamon Tapp, for it separates the undeveloped seeds from the good ones.

FARM PRACTICE SUMMARY FOR 1943

\$8,933.95 was the total labor income of the Bailey Future Farmers during 1943. Fifty-seven members made project plans and fifty-three carried the program to completion.

In making an average labor income of \$165 per member, tobacco proved to be the greatest source. The number of projects completed were as follows:

corn	24
tobacco	16
hogs	21
poultry	6

soybeans	10
cotton	2
wheat	3

OTHER PRACTICES

Practices other than production enterprise projects consist of 18 improved projects and 567 supplementary improved practices which were carried out on the boys' home farms.

The individual incomes from projects varied widely, the lowest being a loss of \$6.25, and the largest \$510.00 gain.

An average of two projects were completed by each member of the chapter.

NIGHT CLASS CONTINUES

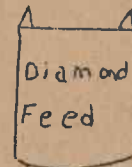
At the agriculture building, the class in farm machinery repair meets every Wednesday night from 7:30 to 10:30.
