This party was given to learn more about children to notice their actions, and to learn how to make them feel at ease.

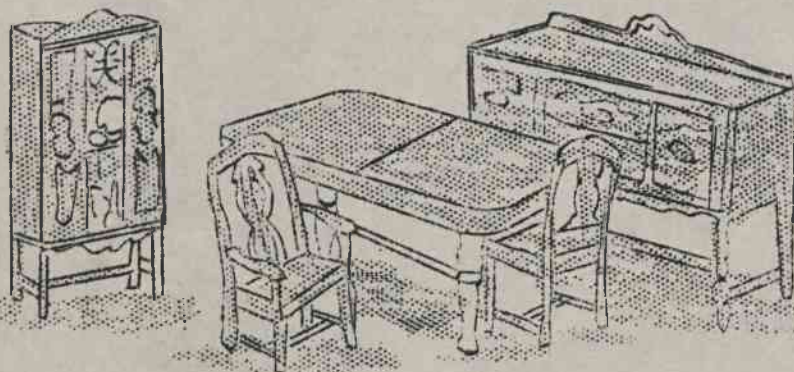
Apparently the little folks enjoyed the coloring of the eggs best of all. Games were played and the story Penny Pouch was read to them.
